

URANIUM

After careful consideration of the voluminous material placed in the public record by both proponents and opponents of uranium mining and milling in Virginia, The Piedmont Environmental Council has concluded that despite more than three years of public inquiry at great expense to the taxpayers of the Commonwealth, there is no convincing evidence that uranium mining and milling can be conducted in Virginia in a manner that ensures the present and future safety of Virginia's residents and environment.

PEC therefore strongly recommends that the current moratorium on uranium mining and milling in Virginia be continued indefinitely and that the expenditure of the Commonwealth's funds to study the subject be discontinued promptly.


URANIUM OPERATIONS

POLICY POSITION

PEC urges the passage of a statewide moratorium on further exploration and any mining and milling of radioactive materials such as uranium, until such time as it can be determined whether radioactive materials can be extracted safely and without adverse effects on the land and water resources and the population in Virginia; or, whether the exploration for mining and milling of uranium should be permitted in Virginia. If the determination is made to permit said exploration, mining and milling, the moratorium should be extended until an adequate regulatory structure for a uranium extraction industry can be formulated and put in place; and until sufficient baseline data are collected for comparison and monitoring purposes.

PEC PROGRAM

PEC, in continuing recognition of the serious nature of the uranium development issue, will continue its uranium project under the present committee, with ongoing Board and staff support, stressing educational and cooperative efforts in as large an area of the state as possible, and giving assistance and advice where and when needed, within the budgetary limits of PEC's financial resources.
